### **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF OHIO BOARD OF PHARMACY**

This Settlement Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy (Board) and James Pharmacy Inc. ("James Pharmacy") for the purpose of resolving all issues between the parties relating to the Board investigation of two employees performing duties of a pharmacy technician without maintaining appropriate registration with the Board. Together, the Board and James Pharmacy are referred to hereinafter as "the parties."

#### **JURISDICTION**

1. Pursuant to Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code and the rules adopted thereunder, the Board has the authority to suspend, revoke, restrict, limit, or refuse to grant or renew any license issued pursuant to Section 4729.54 of the Ohio Revised Code.
2. James Pharmacy has an active TDDD license with the Board under license number 02-0171600, which lists John F. Pangrac, RPh, as the Responsible Person.

#### **FACTS**

1. The Board initiated an investigation of James Pharmacy, TDDD license number 02-0171600, related to two employees performing the duties of a pharmacy technician without maintaining appropriate registration with the Board.
2. On or about March 3, 2022, the Board sent a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to James Pharmacy, which outlined the allegations and provided notice of its right to a hearing, its rights in such hearing, and its right to submit contentions in writing.

WHEREFORE, the parties desire to resolve the issues relating to the above-referenced findings without resorting to further administrative or judicial proceedings.

## TERMS

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein expressed, the parties knowingly and voluntarily agree as follows:

1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated in this Settlement Agreement as though fully set forth herein.
2. James Pharmacy neither admits nor denies the allegations stated in the Notice of Opportunity for Hearing letter dated March 3, 2022, however, the Board has evidence sufficient to sustain the allegations, finds them to violate Ohio's pharmacy law as set forth in the Notice, and hereby adjudicates the same.
3. James Pharmacy agrees to pay to the Board a monetary penalty the amount of \$250. This fine will be attached to James Pharmacy's license record and must be paid no later than 180 days from the effective date of this Order. To pay this fine, login to [www.elicense.ohio.gov](http://www.elicense.ohio.gov) and process the items in the cart.
4. The Board hereby imposes a written reprimand on James Pharmacy's TDDD license, number 02-0171600.
5. James Pharmacy agrees and acknowledges that this Board disciplinary action must be disclosed to the proper licensing authority of any state or jurisdiction, as required by any such state or jurisdiction, in which it currently holds a professional license, including the Board on renewal applications or applications for a new license.
6. James Pharmacy agrees to comply with all federal and state requirements related to Terminal Distributors of Dangerous Drugs, including but not limited to, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4729. and the Rules adopted thereunder, Chapter 3719. and the Rules adopted thereunder, Chapter 3715. and the Rules adopted thereunder as well as the "Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act," 52 Stat. 1040 (1938), 21 U.S.C.A. 301 and Chapter 21, Section 360 of the United States Code, and Section 207.20 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Any violation by James Pharmacy of the terms of one or more federal or state requirements may constitute sufficient grounds for further enforcement action related to any licenses granted to James Pharmacy by the Board and will NOT discharge James Pharmacy from any obligation under the terms of this Agreement.
7. James Pharmacy agrees to pay all reasonable costs associated with the collection of any payment, and of the prosecution of any violation of this Agreement.
8. James Pharmacy understands that it has the right to be represented by counsel for review and execution of this agreement.
9. This Agreement is binding upon any and all successors, assigns, affiliates, and subsidiaries of the parties or any other corporation through whom or with whom James Pharmacy will operate.

10. James Pharmacy waives its opportunity to be heard pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code and waives any right to appeal.
11. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts or facsimiles, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
12. All parties to this Agreement understand that this document is a public record pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 149.43.
13. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties, there being no other agreement of any kind, verbal or otherwise, which varies the terms of this Agreement.
14. If any of the provisions, terms, or clauses of this Agreement are declared illegal, unenforceable, or ineffective by an authority of competent jurisdiction, those provisions, terms, and clauses shall be deemed severable, such that all other provisions, terms, and clauses of this Agreement shall remain valid and binding upon both Parties.
15. This Agreement shall become effective upon the date of the Board President's signature below.



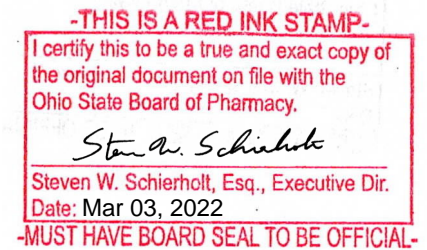

Dear James Pharmacy and Mr. Pangrac:

**You are hereby notified, in accordance with the provisions of Section 119.07 of the Ohio Revised Code the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy (Board) proposes to take action against your license as a Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs under authority of Section (TDDD) 4729.57 of the Revised Code.**

**JURISDICTION**

1. Pursuant to section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code and the rules adopted thereunder, the Board has the authority to suspend, revoke, restrict, limit or refuse to grant or renew any license issued pursuant to section 4729.54 of the Ohio Revised Code to practice as a TDDD in the state of Ohio. Additionally, Section 4729.57 of the Revised Code grants the Board the authority to impose a monetary penalty or forfeiture not to exceed in severity any fine designated under the Revised Code for a similar offense or \$1,000 if the acts committed have not been classified as an offense by the Revised Code.
2. James Pharmacy Inc., located at 623 LaGrange Street, Toledo, Ohio, has an active TDDD license with the Board under license number 02-0171600, which lists John Pangrac, RPh, as the Responsible Person.

**ALLEGATIONS**

1. On or about August 16, 2021, an inspection of James Pharmacy Inc., 623 LaGrange Street, Toledo, Ohio, revealed two (2) pharmacy employees were performing pharmacy technician duties without proper registration with the Board. The inspection revealed Certified pharmacy technician Brandi Renee Burrell and pharmacy technician Trainee Stacy Marie Mitchell had been working as pharmacy technicians at James Pharmacy, Inc. from on or about July 2, 2021, to on or about August 16, 2021, without Board issued registration.

2. On or about September 28, 2021, John Pangrac spoke with an agent of the Board and made the following statements:
  - a. He became aware of the expired technician registrations for Stacy Marie Mitchell and Brandi Renee Burrell during the August 16, 2021, Board of Pharmacy inspection.
  - b. He was aware that the Board of Pharmacy had passed resolutions and waivers regarding technician registrations and believed that these would continue until the pandemic ended.
  - c. He was not aware that resolutions regarding pharmacy technicians had been replaced.

#### **POTENTIAL VIOLATIONS OF LAW**

1. Such conduct, as set forth in the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes a violation of Section 4729.95(C) of the ORC, No terminal distributor of dangerous drugs shall knowingly allow any person employed or otherwise under the control of the person who owns, manages, or conducts the terminal distributor to violate division (A) which states: No person who is not a pharmacist, pharmacy intern, registered pharmacy technician, certified pharmacy technician, or pharmacy technician trainee shall knowingly engage in any of the activities listed in section 4729.91 of the Revised Code in a location licensed as a terminal distributor of dangerous drugs, a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable by a maximum penalty of \$4,000.
2. Such conduct, as set forth in the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes a violation of each of the following divisions of Section 4729.55 of the ORC, TDDD license requirements, each violation punishable by a maximum penalty of \$1,000: Adequate safeguards are assured that the applicant will carry on the business of a terminal distributor of dangerous drugs in a manner that allows pharmacists and pharmacy interns employed by the terminal distributor to practice pharmacy in a safe and effective manner, ORC 4729.55(D).
3. Such conduct, as set forth in the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes a violation of each of the following divisions of Section 4729.57 of the ORC, each violation punishable by a maximum penalty of \$1,000:
  - a. Violating any rule of the board, ORC Section 4729.57(B)(2); and/or
  - b. Violating any provision of this chapter, ORC Section 4729.57(B)(3); and/or
  - c. Ceasing to satisfy the qualifications of a TDDD set forth in 4729.55 of the Revised Code, ORC Section 4729.57(B)(7); and/or
  - d. Any other cause for which the board may impose discipline as set forth in rules adopted under section 4729.26 of the Revised Code, ORC Section 4729.57(B)(10).

4. Such conduct as set forth in the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes a violation of the following sections of Rule 4729:5-2-01 of the OAC, effective March 1, 2019, each punishable by a maximum penalty of \$500:
  - a. The person to whom the terminal distributor of dangerous drugs license has been issued and all pharmacists on duty are responsible for compliance with all state and federal laws, regulations, and rules governing the distribution of drugs and the practice of pharmacy, OAC Rule 4729:5-2-01(A)(3); and/or
  - b. The responsible person to whom the terminal distributor of dangerous drugs license has been issued and all licensed health professionals on duty are responsible for compliance with all state and federal laws, regulations, and rules governing the distribution of dangerous drugs, OAC Rule 4729:5-2-01(E)(4); and/or
  - c. The responsible person shall be responsible for ensuring the terminal distributor of dangerous drugs requirements are met, including, but not limited to, the supervision and control of dangerous drugs as required in division (B) of section 4729.55 of the Revised Code, adequate safeguards as required in division (C) of section 4729.55 of the Revised Code, security and control of dangerous drugs and maintaining all drug records otherwise required, OAC Rule 4729:5-2-01(E)(6).
  
5. Such conduct, as set forth in the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes a violation of the following sections of Rule 4729:5-4-01 of the OAC, effective March 1, 2019, each violation punishable by a maximum penalty of \$1,000 if committed by an organization:
  - a. Violating any rule of the board, OAC Rule 4729:5-4-01(B)(2); and/or
  - b. Violating any provision of Chapter 4729. of the Revised Code, OAC Rule 4729:5-4-01(B)(3); and/or
  - c. Ceasing to satisfy the qualifications of a terminal distributor of dangerous drugs set forth in section 4729.55 of the Revised Code, OAC Rule 4729:5-4-01(B)(7).



You may appear at such hearing in person, by your attorney, or by such other representative as is permitted to practice before the agency, or you may present your position, arguments or contentions in writing; and, at this hearing, you may also present evidence and examine any witnesses appearing for and against you. **If you are a corporation, you must be represented at the hearing by an attorney licensed to practice in the state of Ohio.**

**YOU ARE FURTHER ADVISED** that if there is no request for such a hearing received by the Board on or prior to the 30<sup>th</sup> day following the mailing of this notice, the State of Board of Pharmacy, upon consideration of the aforementioned allegations against you, may take action without such a hearing.

This Settlement Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy (OSBP) and James Pharmacy, for the purpose of resolving all issues between the parties relating to the OSBP investigation of the error in dispensing of RX#2319300. Together, OSBP and James Pharmacy are referred to hereinafter as "the parties."

**JURISDICTION**

1. Pursuant to Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code and the rules adopted thereunder, the OSBP has the authority to suspend, revoke, or refuse to grant or renew any license issued pursuant to Section 4729.55 of the Ohio Revised Code to practice pharmacy the state of Ohio.
2. James Pharmacy is a licensed Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs under license number 02-0171600.

**FACTS**

1. On or about October 20, 2015, the OSBP initiated an investigation of James Pharmacy, Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs license number 02-0171600, related to James Pharmacy's error in dispensing of RX#2319300.
2. On or about August 24, 2016, the OSBP sent a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing to James Pharmacy, which outlined the allegations and provided notice of their right to a hearing, their rights in such hearing, and their right to submit contentions in writing.
3. On or about September 9, 2016, James Pharmacy timely requested an administrative hearing, which was subsequently scheduled for February 8, 2017.

WHEREFORE, the parties desire to resolve the issues relating to the above-referenced findings without resorting to further administrative or judicial proceedings.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein expressed, the parties knowingly and voluntarily agree as follows:


1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated in this Settlement Agreement as though fully set forth herein.
2. James Pharmacy neither admits nor denies the allegations stated in the Notice of Opportunity for hearing letter dated August 24, 2016; however, the OSBP has evidence sufficient to sustain the allegations and hereby adjudicates the same.
3. James Pharmacy agrees to pay to the OSBP the amount of \$3,500.00, by means of a cashier's check made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio," mailed with the enclosed form to the OSBP, 77 South High Street, 17<sup>th</sup> Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215-6126, no later than 30 days from the effective date of this Agreement.
4. James Pharmacy and John Pangrac, RPh agree and acknowledge that this OSBP disciplinary action must be disclosed to the proper licensing authority of any state or jurisdiction in which James Pharmacy currently holds a professional license, including the OSBP on renewal applications or applications for a new license.
5. James Pharmacy agrees to comply with all federal and state requirements related to Terminal Distributors of Dangerous Drugs, including but not limited to, Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4729, and the Rules adopted thereunder, Chapter 3719, and the Rules adopted thereunder, Chapter 3715, and the Rules adopted thereunder as well as the "Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act," 52 Stat. 1040 (1938), 21 U.S.C.A. 301 and Chapter 21, Section 360 of the United States Code, and Section 207.20 of the Code of Federal Regulations. 13. This Agreement shall become effective upon the date of the Board President's signature below.







You are hereby notified, in accordance with the provisions of Section 119.07 of the Ohio Revised Code the state of Ohio Board of Pharmacy (Board) proposes to take action against your license as a Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs under authority of Section (TDDD) 4729.57 of the Revised Code.

**JURISDICTION**

1. Pursuant to Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code and the rules adopted thereunder, the Board has the authority to suspend, revoke, or refuse to grant or renew any license issued pursuant to Section 4729.55 of the Ohio Revised Code to practice as a TDDD in the state of Ohio. Additionally, Section 4729.57 of the Revised Code grants the Board the authority to impose a monetary penalty or forfeiture not to exceed in severity any fine designated under the Revised Code for a similar offense or \$1,000 if the acts committed have not been classified as an offense by the Revised Code.
2. James Pharmacy has a current TDDD license with the Board under license numbers 02-0171600 which is valid through March 31, 2017 and lists John Pangrac as the Responsible Person.

**ALLEGATIONS**

1. On or about May 27, 2015, Pharmacist John Pangrac verified and dispensed prescription #2319300. Patient L.K. was prescribed Suboxone 2-0.5mg SL Film; however, the actual drug dispensed was Suboxone 8-2mg SL Film.
2. On or about July 23, 2015, Pharmacist Keith Barga verified and dispensed prescription #2337372. Patient L.K. was prescribed Suboxone 2-0.5mg SL Film; however, the actual drug dispensed was Suboxone 8-2mg SL Film.

### POTENTIAL VIOLATIONS OF LAW

1. Such conduct as set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) of the Allegations Section, if proven, each constitutes a violation of Section 4729.55(D) of the ORC, adequate safeguards are assured to carry on the business of a terminal distributor of dangerous drugs in a manner that allows pharmacists and pharmacy interns employed by the terminal distributor to practice pharmacy in a safe and effective manner, each violation being an unclassified offense, each punishable by a maximum penalty of \$1,000.
2. Such conduct as set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) of the Allegations Section, if proven, each constitutes a violation of each of the following divisions of Section 4729.57 of the ORC, each violation constituting a minor misdemeanor, each punishable by a maximum penalty of \$1,000 if committed by an organization:
  - a. Violating any provision of this chapter, ORC Section 4729.57(A)(3); and/or
  - b. Ceasing to satisfy the qualifications of a TDDD set forth in 4729.55 of the Revised Code, ORC Section 4729.57(A)(7).
3. Such conduct as set forth in paragraph (1) and (2) of the Allegations section, if proven, constitutes a violation of Section 3715.52(A)(2) of the ORC, the adulteration or misbranding of any food, drug, device or cosmetic, each constituting a misdemeanor of the fourth degree, each punishable by a maximum fine of \$2,000 if committed by an organization.
4. Such conduct as set forth in paragraph (1) and (2) of the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes a violation of Section 3715.64(A)(1), Misbranded drug – its labeling is false or misleading in any particular, each constituting misdemeanor of the fourth degree, each punishable by a maximum penalty of \$250.
5. Such conduct as set forth in paragraph (1) and (2) of the Allegations Section, if proven, constitutes the following violation of Section 3715.64(A)(10) of the ORC, Misbranding, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree, each punishable by a maximum penalty of \$2,000 if committed by an organization:
  - a. It is a drug and its container is so made, formed, or filled as to be misleading, ORC 3715.64 Section (A)(10)(a); and/or
  - b. The drug sold or dispensed is not the brand or drug specifically prescribed or ordered or, when dispensed by a pharmacist upon prescription, is neither the brand or drug prescribed nor a generically equivalent drug, ORC Section 3715.64(A)(10)(d).
6. Such conduct as set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) of the Allegations Section, if proven, each constitutes a violation of the following Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4729-9-19(A)(4), not of good moral character and habits, each punishable by a maximum fine of \$1,000.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED, in accordance with the provisions of Chapters 119. and 4729. of the Ohio Revised Code, that you are entitled to a hearing before the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy, if you request such a hearing within thirty 30 days of the date of the mailing of this notice.

**YOU ARE FURTHER ADVISED** that if there is no request for such a hearing received by the Board on or prior to the 30<sup>th</sup> day following the mailing of this notice, the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy, upon consideration of the aforementioned allegations against you, may take action without such a hearing.
