The State Board of Pharmacy convened in Studio Three, Vern Riffe Center for Government and the Arts, 77 South High Street, Columbus, Ohio with the following members present:

Suzanne L. Neuber, R.Ph. (President); Diane Adelman, R.Ph.; Robert Cavendish, R.Ph.; Paul Lamping, R.Ph.; Ruth Plant, R.Ph.; and Nicholas Repke, Public Member.

Also present were Assistant Attorney General Mary Hollern, Compliance Administrator Tim Benedict, and Compliance Supervisor Robert Cole.

Mrs. Plant moved that the Board go into Executive Session for the purpose of conferring with the Assistant Attorney General regarding pending and imminent court matters and the investigation of complaints regarding licensees and registrants. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lamping and a roll call vote was conducted by President Neuber as follows: Adelman-Yes, Cavendish-Yes, Lamping-Yes, Plant-Yes, and Repke-Yes.

The Executive Session was concluded and the meeting opened to the public. The Executive Director reported that the following settlement agreement in the matter of Robert J. Dougherty, R.Ph. was finalized by the Board as follows:

<u>SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY</u> (Docket No. D-960612-063)

In the Matter of:

ROBERT J. DOUGHERTY, R.Ph.

131 W. Reynolds Street Urbana, Ohio 43078 (R.Ph. No. 03-3-15779)

This Settlement Agreement is entered into by and between Robert J. Dougherty, R.Ph. and the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy, a state agency charged with enforcing the Pharmacy Practice Act and Dangerous Drug Distribution Act, Chapter 4729. of the Ohio Revised Code.

Robert J. Dougherty enters into this Agreement being fully informed of his rights afforded under Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, including the right to representation by counsel and the right to a formal adjudication hearing on the issues contained herein.

Robert J. Dougherty is knowingly and voluntarily acknowledging that, in order to settle the charges that have been filed by the Board against him, and in order to obviate the need to conduct an administrative hearing to consider the disciplinary sanctions against his license to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio, Robert J. Dougherty enters into this Agreement on the basis of the following stipulations, admissions, and understandings:

- (A) The Ohio State Board of Pharmacy is empowered by Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code to suspend, revoke, place on probation, refuse to grant or renew an identification card, or impose a monetary penalty on the license holder for violation of any of the enumerated grounds.
- (B) On or about June 12, 1996, pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, Robert J. Dougherty was notified of the allegations or charges against him, his right to a hearing, his rights in such hearing, and his right to submit contentions in writing. Further, a hearing was requested and scheduled for December 4, 1996; however, the hearing was continued by the Board.
- (C) Robert J. Dougherty stipulates to the allegations stated in the Notice of Opportunity for hearing letter; and the Board herein adjudicates the same:
 - (1) Records of the Board indicate that Robert J. Dougherty was originally licensed to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio on January 22, 1985, and that his license was summarily suspended in accordance with Section 3719.121(B) of the Ohio Revised Code on June 12, 1996.
 - (2) Robert J. Dougherty did, on or about June 4, 1996, knowingly use a controlled substance when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code, to wit: when the Urbana Police Department responded to a call regarding his possible drug overdose, Robert J. Dougherty admitted that he had taken a large number of "prescription Tylenol." Robert J. Dougherty was observed to be under the influence of drugs to the point that he had to be arrested for his own safety. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.11 of the Ohio Revised Code.
 - (3) Robert J. Dougherty did, on or about June 4, 1996, knowingly obtain or possess controlled substances when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code, to wit: Robert J. Dougherty possessed without prescription in his home the following drugs:

Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.11 of the Ohio Revised Code as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996.

(4) Robert J. Dougherty did, on or about June 4, 1996, possess dangerous drugs when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 4729. and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code, to wit: Robert J. Dougherty

possessed without prescription in his home the following dangerous drugs:

Such conduct is in violation of Section 4729.51(C)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code.

- (5) Robert J. Dougherty is abusing controlled substances to such a degree as to render him unfit to practice pharmacy, to wit: on June 4, 1996, Robert J. Dougherty was observed to be under the influence of drugs to such a degree that he was in risk of personal harm; and, within the immediately preceding twenty-four hours, Robert J. Dougherty was involved in two separate automobile accidents, the second of which he had to be awakened twice by the police officer investigating the accident. Such conduct indicates that Robert J. Dougherty falls within the ambit of Sections 3719.121(B) and 4729.16(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (6) Robert J. Dougherty did, on or about unknown dates prior to June 4, 1996, with purpose to deprive, knowingly obtain or exert control over dangerous drugs, the property of Rite Aid Discount Pharmacy #2733, 1207 North Limestone Street, Springfield, Ohio 45503 beyond the express or implied consent of the owner, to wit: while practicing pharmacy at Rite Aid, Robert J. Dougherty stole the following drugs:

Such conduct is in violation of Section 2913.02 of the Ohio Revised Code.

(7) Robert J. Dougherty did, on or about June 4, 1996, and dates preceding, misbrand drugs, to wit: Robert J. Dougherty took various drugs from his place of employment, Rite Aid Discount Pharmacy #2733, removed them from their proper containers, commingled them, and stored them in various articles of clothing in his home and not in properly marked or labeled containers. Said drugs have subsequently been identified as the following:

Such conduct is in violation of Section 3715.52(B)(2) of the Ohio Revised Code.

Wherefore, in consideration of the foregoing and mutual promises hereinafter set forth, and in lieu of any formal proceedings at this time, Robert J. Dougherty knowingly and voluntarily agrees with the State Board of Pharmacy to the following:

- (A) The removal of the Summary Suspension Order issued June 12, 1996, pursuant to Section 3719.121(B) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (B) The indefinite suspension of his pharmacist identification card, No. 03-3-15779.
 - (1) Pursuant to Rule 4729-9-01(F) of the Ohio Administrative Code, Robert J. Dougherty may not be employed by or work in a facility licensed by the Board of Pharmacy to possess or distribute dangerous drugs during such period of suspension.
 - (2) Division (B) of Section 4729.16 of the Revised Code provides that: "Any individual whose identification card is revoked, suspended, or refused, shall return his identification card and certificate of registration to the offices of the state board of pharmacy within ten days after receipt of the notice of such action." The certificate and identification card should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- (C) In June, 1998, or thereafter, the Board will consider any petition filed by Robert J. Dougherty for a hearing, pursuant to Revised Code Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, upon the question of the reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy in Ohio. The Board will consider the reinstatement of the license only if the following conditions have been met:
 - (1) Robert J. Dougherty must enter into a new contract with a limited treatment provider acceptable to the Board for a period of not less than five years from the effective date of this Settlement Agreement and, upon signing, submit a copy of the contract to the Board office. The contract must provide:

- (a) random, <u>observed</u> urine drug screens shall be conducted at least every three months. The urine drug screens must report testing for alcohol, opiates, benzodiazepines, and carisoprodol; and must also report testing for creatinine or specific gravity of the sample as the dilutional standard;
- (b) regular attendance, at least three times per week, at an Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, and/or similar support group meetings, and at meetings of a professional support group, is required during outpatient treatment and/or during aftercare; and
- (c) the program shall immediately report to the Board of Pharmacy any positive urine screens and/or other violations of the contract.
- (2) Robert J. Dougherty must provide, at the time of petitioning the Board for reinstatement, written documentation from his treatment provider regarding compliance with the program pursuant to the contract including all urine drug screen reports.

If, in the judgment of the Board, Robert J. Dougherty appears to have violated or breached any terms or conditions of this Agreement, the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy reserves the right to institute formal disciplinary proceedings for any and all possible violations or breaches, including but not limited to, alleged violation of the laws of Ohio occurring before the effective date of this Agreement.

Robert J. Dougherty acknowledges that he has had an opportunity to ask questions concerning the terms of this agreement and that all questions asked have been answered in a satisfactory manner. Any action initiated by the Board based on alleged violation of this Agreement shall comply with the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code.

Robert J. Dougherty waives any and all claims or causes of action he may have against the State of Ohio or the Board, and its members, officers, employees, and/or agents of either, arising out of matters which are the subject of this Agreement.

In the event the Board, in its discretion, does not approve this Agreement, this settlement offer is withdrawn and shall be of no evidentiary value and shall not be relied upon or introduced in any disciplinary action or appeal by either party. Robert J. Dougherty agrees that should the Board reject this Agreement and if this case proceeds to hearing, he will assert no claim that the Board was prejudiced by its review and discussion of this Agreement or of any information relating thereto.

This Settlement Agreement shall be considered a public record, as that term is used in Section 149.43 of the Ohio Revised Code, and shall become effective upon the Board President's signature below.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

(1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (19) of the Findings of Fact constitute violating provisions of the federal narcotic law or Chapter 2925. or 3719. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(3) of Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby takes the following actions in the matter of Orchard Drugs:

- (A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and Conclusion of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends indefinitely the Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs License, No. 02-0606500, of Orchard Drugs.
- (B) Further, the Board stays the suspension and places Orchard Drugs on probation for five years, effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order. The terms of probation are as follows:
 - (1) Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby declares that Orchard Drugs' license is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a training site for pharmacy interns.
 - (2) Orchard Drugs must not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government.

- (3) Orchard Drugs must abide by the rules of the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
- (4) Orchard Drugs must comply with the terms of this Order.

The Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

(C) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and Conclusion of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby imposes a monetary penalty of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) due and owing within thirty (30) days of the issuance of this Order. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed with the enclosed form to the State Board of Pharmacy, 77 S. High Street, 17th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

Records further reflect that Jack James Wilhelm has been disciplined by the Board on August 16, 1991, for having committed acts constituting gross immorality, dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy, being addicted to or abusing drugs, and willfully violating provisions of the Ohio Revised Code within the meaning of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

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CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (25) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (25) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of willfully violating, conspiring to violate, attempting to violate, or aiding and abetting the violation of provisions of Chapter 2925. or 3719. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(5) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions in the matter of Jack James Wilhelm:

- (A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (1) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends the pharmacist identification card, No. 03-1-09450, held by Jack James Wilhelm indefinitely and such suspension is effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order. Pursuant to Rule 4729-9-01(F) of the Ohio Administrative Code, Jack James Wilhelm may not be employed by or work in a facility licensed by the Board of Pharmacy to possess or distribute dangerous drugs during such period of suspension.
 - (1) Two years after the effective date of this Order, the Board will reinstate Jack James Wilhelm's license to practice pharmacy in Ohio provided that he takes and successfully completes the Jurisprudence Examination offered by the Board prior to that date. If Jack James Wilhelm has not successfully completed the examination prior to two years from the effective date of this Order, his license will remain suspended until this condition has been achieved.
 - (2) Further, upon reinstatement of Jack James Wilhelm's license, his identification card will be placed on probation for five years. The terms of probation are as follows:
 - (a) Jack James Wilhelm may not serve as a responsible pharmacist.
 - (b) Jack James Wilhelm must not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government.
 - (c) Jack James Wilhelm must abide by the rules of the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
 - (d) Jack James Wilhelm must comply with the terms of this Order.

The Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

(B) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (2) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby imposes a monetary penalty

of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) due and owing within thirty (30) days of the

issuance of this Order. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed with the enclosed form to the State Board of Pharmacy, 77 S. High Street, 17th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320.

Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby declares that Jack James Wilhelm's pharmacist identification card is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a preceptor and training pharmacy interns.

Division (B) of Section 4729.16 of the Revised Code provides that: "Any individual whose identification card is revoked, suspended, or refused, shall return his identification card and certificate of registration to the offices of the state board of pharmacy within ten days after receipt of the notice of such action." The certificate and identification card should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

- (1) Records of the Board of Pharmacy indicate that Robert Oberlin Urfer was originally licensed in the state of Ohio on August 4, 1969, pursuant to examination, and is currently licensed to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio. Records further reflect that, during the relevant time periods stated herein, Robert Oberlin Urfer was the Responsible Pharmacist at Orchard Drugs, 4025 Talmadge Road, Toledo, Ohio 43623, pursuant to Sections 4729.27 and 4729.55 of the Ohio Revised Code and Rule 4729-5-11 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (2) Robert Oberlin Urfer as the Responsible Pharmacist did, on or about the following dates, sell, under the exemptions of Section 3719.15 of the Ohio Revised Code to the same person (on each occasion) preparations included within Section 3719.15, when Robert Oberlin Urfer and pharmacists under his control knew or by reasonable diligence could have ascertained that the sale provided the recipient with more than one such preparation within a forty-eight consecutive hour period:

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (19) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (19) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of willfully violating, conspiring to violate, attempting to violate, or aiding and abetting the violation of provisions of Chapter 2925. or 3719. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(5) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions in the matter of Robert Oberlin Urfer:

- (A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (1) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends indefinitely the pharmacist identification card, No. 03-1-09283, held by Robert Oberlin Urfer.
- (B) Further, the Board stays the suspension and places Robert Oberlin Urfer on probation for five years, effective as of the mailing of this Order. The terms of probation are as follows:
 - (1) Robert Oberlin Urfer must take and successfully complete, prior to July 31, 1997, the Jurisprudence Examination offered by the Board. If Robert Oberlin Urfer has not successfully completed the examination prior to July 31, 1997, his license will be suspended until this condition has been achieved. Division (B) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code provides: "Any individual whose identification card is revoked, suspended, or refused, shall return his identification card and certificate of registration to the offices of the state board of pharmacy within ten days after receipt of notice of such action." The certificate and identification card should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.
 - (2) Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby declares that Robert Oberlin Urfer's pharmacist identification card is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a preceptor and training pharmacy interns.
 - (3) Robert Oberlin Urfer must not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government.
 - (4) Robert Oberlin Urfer must abide by the rules of the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
 - (5) Robert Oberlin Urfer must comply with the terms of this Order.

The Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

(C) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (2) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby imposes a monetary penalty

of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) due and owing within thirty (30) days of the issuance of this Order. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed with the enclosed form to the State Board of Pharmacy, 77 S. High Street, 17th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

- (1) Records of the Board of Pharmacy indicate that Thomas A. Szymczak was originally licensed in the state of Ohio on July 30, 1973, pursuant to examination, and is currently licensed to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio.
- (2) Thomas A. Szymczak did, on or about the following dates, intentionally make and/or knowingly possess false or forged prescriptions, to wit: Thomas A. Szymczak created and/or possessed the following prescriptions for Alprazolam 0.5mg which were not authorized by a physician:

- (b) Some prescription records were kept in a place other than the pharmacy area, unsecured and accessible to store personnel;
- (c) Prescriptions were not routinely initialed;
- (d) Hard-copy prescriptions and computer records do not indicate refill authorization;
- (e) Pertinent prescription information was incomplete or omitted entirely;
- (f) Multiple prescriptions were partially filled, and original prescriptions were returned to the patient;
- (g) Original prescriptions numbered 180581, 190587, and 2012, indicate that Diazepam was dispensed; however, refill records indicate that Valium was dispensed; and
- (h) Original prescriptions numbered 217632, 230968, 233739, and 229450 were located in prescription files, however, they were not found in the computer data.

Such conduct is in violation of Rule 4729-5-17 of the Ohio Administrative Code.

- (18) Thomas A. Szymczak did, from May 1, 1993, to January 18, 1995, with the purpose to deprive, knowingly obtain or exert control over the property of Rite Aid #2310, 213 Main St., Toledo, Ohio beyond the express or implied consent of the owner, to wit: Thomas A. Szymczak stole 700 units of Anadrol 50mg, a schedule III controlled substance. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2913.02 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (19) Thomas A. Szymczak did, on or about December 20, 1995, possess a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding the bulk amount, but in an amount less than three times that amount, to wit: Thomas A. Szymczak possessed, outside the confines of the pharmacy and without a prescription, 215 units of Anadrol 50mg. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(4) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

(1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (19) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

(2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (4) and (6) through (19) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of willfully violating, conspiring to violate, attempting to violate, or aiding and abetting the violation of provisions of Chapter 2925., 3719., or 4729. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(5) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions in the matter of Thomas A. Szymczak:

- (A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends the pharmacist identification card, No. 03-3-10438, held by Thomas A. Szymczak for one year and such suspension is effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order. Pursuant to Rule 4729-9-01(F) of the Ohio Administrative Code, Thomas A. Szymczak may not be employed by or work in a facility licensed by the Board of Pharmacy to possess or distribute dangerous drugs during such period of suspension.
- (B) Upon reinstatement of Thomas A. Szymczak's license to practice pharmacy in Ohio, the pharmacist identification card, No. 03-3-10438, will be placed on probation for five years. The terms of probation are as follows:
 - (1) Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of pharmacy hereby declares that Thomas A. Szymczak's pharmacist identification card is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a preceptor and training pharmacy interns.
 - (2) Thomas A. Szymczak may not serve as a responsible pharmacist.
 - (3) Thomas A. Szymczak must inform all employers of his probationary status with the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
 - (4) Thomas A. Szymczak must not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government.
 - (5) Thomas A. Szymczak must abide by the rules of the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
 - (6) Thomas A. Szymczak must comply with the terms of this Order.

The Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

Division (B) of Section 4729.16 of the Revised Code provides that: "Any individual whose identification card is revoked, suspended, or refused, shall return his identification card and certificate of registration to the offices of the state board of pharmacy within ten days after receipt of the notice of such action." The certificate and identification card should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

- (1) Records of the Board of Pharmacy indicate that Thomas J. Hutton is the Responsible Pharmacist at Hutton's Pharmacy pursuant to Sections 4729.27 and 4729.55 of the Ohio Revised Code and Rule 4729-5-11 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (2) Hutton's Pharmacy did, on or about the following dates, sell under the exemptions of Section 3719.15 of the Ohio Revised Code to the same person (on each occasion), preparations included within said section, when Hutton's Pharmacy knew or by reasonable diligence could have ascertained that the sale provided the recipient with more than one such preparation within a forty-eight consecutive hour period:

Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(10) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (106) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from November 17, 1990, to October 20, 1991, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 77 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #107 without a legitimate medical purpose. - (126) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from January 28, 1990, to February 21, 1993, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding one hundred times the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 397 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #128 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(10) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (127) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from May 18, 1990, to August 31, 1992, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 76 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #129 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).

- (128) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from February 18, 1990, to September 29, 1992, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding one hundred times the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 283 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #130 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(10) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (129) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from June 1, 1990, to May 19, 1992, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 61 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #131 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (130) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from March 6, 1991, to December 11, 1991, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 42 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #136 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (131) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from March 20, 1990, to March 11, 1994, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding one hundred times the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 527 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #133 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(10) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (132) Hutton's Pharmacy did, from July 25, 1990, to March 12, 1994, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding one hundred times the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy sold 259 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #134 without a legitimate medical purpose. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(10) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (133) Hutton's Pharmacy did, on or about March 15, 1994, manufacture, hold or offer for sale drugs that were misbranded, to wit: agents of the Board recovered 10 bottles of Tussar-2, an exempt narcotic cough syrup, from the dispensing area which had labels not indicating the quantity, and the labels were photo copies which did not indicate the name of the pharmacy. The pharmacy had purchased Tussar-2 in 16oz bottles and repackaged them into 4oz bottles which were not patient-specific. Such conduct is in violation of Section 3715.52(B) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (134) Hutton's Pharmacy did, on March 15, 1994, and on dates immediately preceding, violate a rule of the Board, to wit: Hutton's Pharmacy violated the following rules:

- (a) pharmacists failed to initial prescriptions upon dispensing drugs pursuant thereto in violation of Rule 4729-5-30 of the Ohio Administrative Code;
- (b) the pharmacy did not possess a current copy of federal and state laws, regulations, and rules governing the legal distribution of drugs in Ohio in violation of Rule 4729-9-02(A)(1) of the Ohio Administrative Code; and
- (c) areas of the pharmacy where drugs were stored were not maintained in a clean and orderly condition in violation of Rule 4729-9-02(E)(2) of the Ohio Administrative Code.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraph (134) of the Findings of Fact constitutes violating a rule of the Board as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraph (133) of the Findings of Fact constitutes violating provisions of the "Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act," 52 Stat. 1040(1938), 21 U.S.C.A. 301, or Chapter 3715. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(4) of Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (3) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (132) of the Findings of Fact constitute violating provisions of the federal narcotic law or Chapter 2925. or 3719. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(5) of Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions in the matter of Hutton's Pharmacy:

- (A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (1) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby revokes the terminal distributor license, No. 02-0080700, held by Hutton's Pharmacy effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order.
- (B) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (2) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby revokes the terminal distributor license, No. 02-0080700, held by Hutton's Pharmacy effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order.
- (C) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (3) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby revokes the terminal distributor license, No. 02-0080700, held by Hutton's Pharmacy effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order.

Division (B)(1) of Section 4729.57 of the Ohio Revised Code provides: "Upon the suspension or revocation of a license issued to a terminal distributor of dangeorus drugs or the refusal by the board to renew such a license, the distributor shall immediately surrender his license to the board." The license should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

- (1) Records of the Board of Pharmacy indicate that Thomas Jefferson Hutton was originally licensed in the state of Ohio on November 13, 1974, pursuant to reciprocity, and is a registered pharmacist in the state of Ohio; however, Thomas Jefferson Hutton's license was summarily suspended in accordance with Section 3719.121(B) of the Ohio Revised Code on September 18, 1996. Records further indicate that during the relevant time periods stated herein, Thomas Jefferson Hutton was the Responsible Pharmacist at Hutton's Pharmacy, 2101 Dorr Street, Toledo, Ohio 43607, Terminal Distributor License No. 02-080700, pursuant to Sections 4729.27 and 4729.55 of the Ohio Revised Code and Rule 4729-5-11 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (2) Thomas Jefferson Hutton as the Responsible Pharmacist of Hutton's Pharmacy did, on or about the following dates, sell under the exemptions of Section 3719.15 of the Ohio Revised Code to the same person (on each occasion) preparations included within Section 3719.15, when he or someone under his control knew or by reasonable diligence could have ascertained that the sale provided the recipient with more than one such preparation within a forty-eight consecutive hour period:

Such conduct is in violation of Sections 2925.03(A) and 2925.03(C)(2)(a) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (197) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, from May 23, 1994, to June 11, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold 144 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #113 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).

- (198) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, on July 23, 1996, and July 27, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount less than the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold two bottles of an exempt narcotic preparation excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #113 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Sections 2925.03(A) and 2925.03(C)(2)(a) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (199) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, from May 2, 1994, to June 29, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold 97 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #114 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (200) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, from July 6, 1996 to July 27, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount exceeding the bulk amount, but in an amount less than five times the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold 5 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #114 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Sections 2925.03(A) and 2925.03(C)(2)(c) of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (201) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, from May 2, 1994, to June 29, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold 91 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #117 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (202) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, from July 6, 1996, to August 3, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount exceeding the bulk amount, but in an amount less than five times the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold 7 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #117 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Sections 2925.03(A) and 2925.03(C)(2)(c) of the Ohio Revised Code.

- (203) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, from February 16, 1996, to June 11, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount equal to or exceeding three times the bulk amount, but in an amount less than one hundred times that amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold 10 bottles of exempt narcotic preparations excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #123 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Section 2925.03(A)(7) of the Ohio Revised Code (as was in effect prior to July 1, 1996).
- (204) Thomas Jefferson Hutton did, on July 16, 1996, knowingly sell a controlled substance in an amount less than the bulk amount when the conduct was not in accordance with Chapters 3719., 4729., and 4731. of the Ohio Revised Code and not for a legitimate medical purpose, to wit: Thomas Jefferson Hutton sold one bottle of an exempt narcotic preparation excepted pursuant to Section 3719.15(A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code to patient #123 without a legitimate medical purpose and after being admonished for such conduct on July 19, 1993; March 14, 1994; and March 22, 1996. Such conduct is in violation of Sections 2925.03(A) and 2925.03(C)(2)(a) of the Ohio Revised Code.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (204) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (2) through (133) and (135) through (204) of the Findings of Fact constitute being guilty of willfully violating, conspiring to violate, attempting to violate, or aiding and abetting the violation of provisions of Sections 3715.52 to 3715.72 or Chapter 2925., or 3719. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(5) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 3719.121 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby removes the Summary Suspension Order issued September 18, 1996.

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions in the matter of Thomas Jefferson Hutton:

- (A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (1) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby revokes the pharmacist identification card, No. 03-1-11067, held by Thomas Jefferson Hutton effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order.
- (B) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (2) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby revokes the pharmacist identification card, No. 03-1-11067, held by Thomas Jefferson Hutton effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order.

Further, Thomas Jefferson Hutton may not be employed by or work in any facility licensed by the Board of Pharmacy to possess or distribute dangerous drugs.

Division (B) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code provides: "Any individual whose identification card is revoked, suspended, or refused, shall return his identification card and certificate of registration to the offices of the state board of pharmacy within ten days after receipt of notice of such action." The certificate and identification card should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.

FINDINGS OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

- (1) On March 22, 1996, Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. was notified by letter of his right to a hearing, his rights in such hearing, and his right to submit his contentions in writing.
- (2) As demonstrated by return receipt of March 25, 1996, Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. received the letter of March 22, 1996, informing him of the allegations against him, and his rights.
- (3) Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. requested a hearing and a hearing was scheduled in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (4) Records of the Board of Pharmacy indicate that Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. was originally licensed in the state of Ohio on August 4, 1952, pursuant to examination, and is currently licensed to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio.
- (5) Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. did, on or about the following dates, sell, under the exemptions of Section 3719.15 of the Ohio Revised Code to the same person (on each occasion) preparations included within Section 3719.15, when he knew or by reasonable diligence could have ascertained that the sale provided the recipient with more than one such preparation within a forty-eight consecutive hour period:

Such conduct is in violation of Section 3719.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraph (5) of the Findings of Fact constitutes being guilty of unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraph (5) of the Findings of Fact constitutes being guilty of willfully violating, conspiring to violate, attempting to violate, or aiding and abetting the violation of provisions of Chapter 3719. of the Revised Code as provided in Division (A)(5) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions in the matter of Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr.:

(A) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (1) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby places the identification

card of Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. on probation for two years, effective as of the date of the mailing of this Order. The terms of probation are as follows:

- (1) Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of pharmacy hereby declares that Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr.'s pharmacist identification card is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a preceptor and training pharmacy interns.
- (2) Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. may not serve as a responsible pharmacist.
- (3) Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. must not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government.
- (4) Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. must abide by the rules of the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
- (5) Hubert Burrus Pleasant, Jr. must comply with the terms of this Order.

The Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

- (B) On the basis of the Findings of Fact and paragraph (2) of the Conclusions of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby imposes a monetary penalty of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) due and owing within thirty days of the issuance of this Order. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed to the State Board of Pharmacy, 77 South High Street, 17th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320.
- (C) Further, the Board suspends the monetary penalty due date until the completion of the probation period. If no violations occur throughout the probation period, the monetary penalty will be stayed.

- (1) All monthly activity reports shall be made on Form PHA-0011. If the employee wishes to create his/her own computer-generated Form PHA-0011, it shall be in the exact format as Form PHA-0011 and shall not be submitted in condensed type.
- (2) A monthly activity report shall be submitted to the office no later than the fifth working day after a new calendar month begins. The report shall summarize the previous month's work product as reflected in the daily activity reports. The submission of a monthly activity report does not release the employee from submission of the daily activity report.
- (3) All monthly activity reports shall be accurate reports of work actually conducted during that time period as a Board employee.
- (4) All monthly activity reports shall be signed and dated by the employee.
- (5) All monthly activity reports shall be identified as to which month and year is being reported.
- (6) This report will be completed consistent with this policy and as directed by the Compliance Administrator.

WRITTEN REQUEST TO INSPECT [Res. 89-155]

- (1) Business cards, as issued by the Board, shall be carried at all times when working for the Board and being paid by the State of Ohio.
- (2) Business cards, as issued by the Board, shall be given to persons in any licensed location which you inspect or enter.

USE OF THE BOARD OF PHARMACY'S NCIC NUMBER [Res. 92-204]

- (1) On February 4, 1992, the Ohio Board of Pharmacy was granted a National Crime Information Center (NCIC) Number.
- (2) The use of this number is restricted for use of criminal justice purposes only.
- (3) The reasons for obtaining this number were:

- (a) In 1990, the Ohio Legislature granted the Board the authority to receive mandatory fines and asset seizures. To receive funds from the federal government, an agency must have an NCIC number.
- (b) The NCIC number will allow the Board's investigators to conduct a criminal background on individuals under investigation by the Board when other law enforcement agencies are not actively involved in the investigation.
- (4) The Board of Pharmacy will not have a terminal in the Columbus office due to security reasons.
- (5) Any access to the NCIC system will be in the following manner:
 - (a) If another law enforcement agency is involved in an investigation, that agency will conduct any background investigation through NCIC by access through their terminal using the law enforcement agency's NCIC access number.
 - (b) If another law enforcement agency is not involved in an investigation, the Board's agents may request NCIC access through any law enforcement agency, within Ohio, that has a written agreement with this Board to provide such access to the Board.
 - (c) No Board agent may access NCIC without a Board-issued investigation number having been assigned, and the request being verbally approved by a supervisor.
 - (d) The Board shall keep a bound log book documenting all NCIC inquiries.
 - (e) All agents of the Board, upon receipt of requested NCIC information, shall forward such materials to the Board office for insertion into the investigative file.
 - (f) Any access to the NCIC system, other than described above, is prohibited.

FINDING OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

(1) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller is in compliance with the Order of the Board, Docket No. D-950124-033, dated December 8, 1995.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

The State Board of Pharmacy hereby approves the reinstatement of the pharmacist identification card of Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio and places him on probation for five years from the date his identification card is issued, with the following conditions:

- (A) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller must enter into a new contract, after the effective date of this Order, with a limited treatment provider acceptable to the Board, for a period of not less than five years and submit a copy of the signed contract to the Board office with the renewal application. The contract must provide that:
 - random, <u>observed</u> urine screens shall be conducted at least once every three months. The urine drug screens must report testing for alcohol and must also report testing for creatinine as the dilutional standard or specific gravity;
 - (2) regular attendance, a minimum of three times per week, at an Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, and/or similar support group meeting is required during outpatient treatment and/or during aftercare;
 - (3) the intervener/sponsor shall provide copies of all urine screens to the Ohio Board of Pharmacy in a timely fashion; and
 - (4) the program shall immediately report to the Ohio Board of Pharmacy any violations of the contract and/or lack of cooperation.
- (B) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller must submit quarterly progress reports to the Board (due January 10, April 10, July 10, and October 10 of each year of probation; with the first report due July 10) that include:
 - the written report and documentation provided by the treatment program pursuant to the contract, and
 - (2) a written description of his progress towards recovery and what he has been doing during the previous three months.
- (C) Other terms of probation are as follows:
 - (1) Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby declares that the pharmacist identification card of Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a preceptor and training pharmacy interns.
 - (2) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller may not serve as a responsible pharmacist.
 - (3) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller may not destroy, or may not assist in or witness the destruction of, controlled substances.
 - (4) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller must abide by the contract from the treatment provider and any violation must be reported to the Board immediately.
 - (5) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller must not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government.
 - (6) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller must abide by the rules of the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy.
 - (7) Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller must comply with the terms of this Order.

Jeffrey Scott Dannemiller is hereby advised that the Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.
