## INTRODUCTION

THE MATTER OF CATHERINE ANNE OLSON CAME TO HEARING ON DECEMBER 3, 1987 BEFORE THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS OF THE BOARD: NORMAN LEIBOW, R.Ph. (presiding); GERALD CLOUSE, R.Ph.; TIMOTHY MOORE, R.Ph.; BETTY NICHOL, R.Ph.; JOSEPH SABINO, R.Ph.; JEROME WIESENHAHN, R.Ph.; AND MELVIN WILCZYNSKI, R.Ph.

CATHERINE ANNE OLSON WAS NOT REPRESENTED BY COUNSEL, AND THE STATE OF OHIO WAS REPRESENTED BY CHRISTOPHER COSTANTINI, ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- (1) From the evidence presented, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Catherine Anne Olson failed to renew her identification card on the fifteenth day of September 1987, as required by Section 4729.12 of the Ohio Revised Code, for 1988, when she did not renew until October 5, 1987.
- (2) From the evidence presented, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Catherine Anne Olson failed to renew her identification card on the fifteenth day of September 1983, as required by Section 4729.12 of the Ohio Revised Code, for 1984, when she did not renew until January 6, 1984.
- (3) From the evidence presented, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Catherine Anne Olson did dispense and sell dangerous drugs while not being a registered pharmacist during the lapsed dates of your pharmacist license, in violation of the provisions of Section 4729.28 of the Ohio Revised Code.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that the conduct set forth in paragraphs (1) through (3) of the Findings Of Fact constitutes willful violations of the provisions of Chapter 4729. of the Ohio Revised Code.

ORDER

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions concerning the pharmacist license, No. 03-1-13010, held by Catherine Anne Olson:

(A) On the basis of the Conclusion Of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby imposes a monetary penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500.00).

(B) Further, the Board suspends four hundred dollars of the five hundred dollar monetary penalty imposed above on the condition that Catherine Anne Olson:

- (1) does not violate the drug laws of the state of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government; and
- (2) abides by the rules of the State Board of Pharmacy.

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Order of the Board

The one hundred dollar (\$100.00) monetary penalty that was not suspended in paragraph (B) above is due and owing within thirty (30) days of the issuance of this Order. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed to the State Board of Pharmacy, 65 S. Front Street, Room 504, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320, with the enclosed form.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

It is hereby certified by this Board that the above language is a copy of the Order entered upon its journal in this case.

Section 119.12 of the Revised Code authorizes an appeal from this Order. Such an appeal may be taken to the court of common pleas in the county in which your place of business is located or to said court of the county in which you reside. If you do not have a place of business in Ohio and are not a resident of Ohio, you may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio.

Such an appeal, setting forth the order appealed from and the grounds of the appeal, must be commenced by the filing of a Notice of Appeal with the State Board of Pharmacy and the appropriate court within fifteen (15) days after the mailing of this notice and in accordance with the requirements of Section 119.12 of the Revised Code.
