VS

BETH ANN BUTSCHI, R.Ph.

THE MATTER OF BETH ANN BUTSCHI, DOCKET NO. 6-91-1, WAS HEARD PURSUANT TO CHAPTERS 119. AND 4729. OF THE REVISED CODE ON TUESDAY, JUNE 26, 1984. AFTER CONSIDERATION OF THE EVIDENCE ADDUCED, MOTIONS WERE MADE AND RECORDED THAT THE FOLLOWING ORDER BE ADOPTED:

## ORDER

### Findings Of Fact

- (1) From the evidence presented, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Beth Ann Butschi, on or about March 6, 1984, was found guilty of violating Section 4511.19 of the Revised Code, to wit: driving while under the influence of alcohol.
- (2) From the evidence presented, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Beth Ann Butschi, on February 24, 1984 while being processed following arrest for failure to drive on the right side of the roadway, was found to be in illegal possession of dangerous drugs and controlled substances, to wit: chlorazepate, diazepam, lorazepam, meprobamate, and prazepam; in violation of Section 2925.11 of the Revised Code.
- (3) From the evidence presented, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Beth Ann Butschi violated the provisions of Chapters 3719. and 4729. of the Revised Code; in that, she knowingly possessed controlled substances; in violation of Division (A) of Section 2925.11 of the Revised Code.

### Conclusion Of Law

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that the conduct set forth in paragraphs (1) through (3) of the Findings Of Fact constitutes gross immorality within the meaning of Section 4729.16(A) of the Revised Code.

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Order of the Board

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the foregoing Findings Of Fact and Conclusion Of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby takes the following actions concerning the registered pharmacist identification card of Beth Ann Butschi, R.Ph. No. 03-1-13581:

(A) On the basis of paragraph (1) of the Conclusion Of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends the pharmacist identification card held by Beth Ann Butschi for 12 months.

(B) Further, the Board suspends the 12-month suspension on condition that Beth Ann Butschi does not violate any drug laws of the State of Ohio, any other state, or the federal government, and abides by the rules of the State Board of Pharmacy.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

MOTION CARRIED.

It is hereby certified by this Board that the above language is a copy of the Order entered upon its journal in this case.

Section 119.12 of the Revised Code authorizes an appeal from this Order. Such an appeal may be taken to the court of common pleas in the county in which your place of business is located or to said court of the county in which you reside. If you do not have a place of business in Ohio and are not a resident of Ohio, you may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio.

Such an appeal, setting forth the order appealed from and the grounds of the appeal, must be commenced by the filing of a Notice of Appeal with the State Board of Pharmacy and the appropriate court within fifteen (15) days after the mailing of this notice and in accordance with the requirements of Section 119.12 of the Revised Code.
