### INTRODUCTION

THE MATTER OF ROBERT D. PECKENS CAME TO HEARING ON APRIL 12, 1994, BEFORE THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS OF THE BOARD: JOSEPH R. SABINO, R.Ph. (presiding); ROBERT B. CAVENDISH, R.Ph.; PAUL F. LAMPING, R.Ph.; AMONTE B. LITTLEJOHN, R.Ph.; WAYNE C. MILLER, R.Ph.; TIMOTHY D. MOORE, R.Ph.; SUZANNE L. NEUBER, R.Ph.; RUTH A. PLANT, R.Ph.; AND NICHOLAS R. REPKE., PUBLIC MEMBER.

ROBERT D. PECKENS WAS NOT REPRESENTED BY COUNSEL, AND THE STATE OF OHIO WAS REPRESENTED BY GREGG THORNTON, ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL.

FINDING OF FACT

After having heard the testimony, considered the evidence, observed the demeanor of the witnesses, and weighed their credibility, the State Board of Pharmacy finds the following to be fact:

- (1) Robert D. Peckens, Jr. has complied with the requirements of the Board's Order, Docket No. D-930628-096, dated February 14, 1994.

ACTION OF THE BOARD

The State Board of Pharmacy hereby approves the reinstatement of Robert D. Peckens' pharmacist identification card to practice pharmacy in the state of Ohio and places him on probation until February 24, 1999, with the following conditions:

- (A) Robert D. Peckens must continue with, and abide by the St. John Medical Center Aftercare Treatment Observation/Plan Contract until February 24, 1999, which requires:
  - (1) random observed urine screens shall be conducted at least once every three months for the remainder of the contract;
  - (2) regular attendance, at least three times per week, at an Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, or a similar support group meeting is required; and
  - (3) the program shall immediately report to the Board of Pharmacy any violations of the contract.
- (B) Any change of treatment provider must be reported to the Board within 30 days.

Pursuant to paragraph (D)(1) of Rule 4729-3-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby declares that Robert D. Peckens' pharmacist identification card is not in good standing and thereby denies the privilege of being a preceptor and training pharmacy interns until February 24, 1999.

The Board further stipulates that Robert D. Peckens may not serve as a responsible pharmacist until February 24, 1999.

The Board may at any time revoke probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation. At any time during this period of probation, the Board may revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.
