THE MATTER OF JUDITH K. SMITH CAME ON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY ON MARCH 5, 1991. MOTIONS WERE MADE AND RECORDED THAT THE FOLLOWING ORDER BE ADOPTED:

### ORDER

#### State's Exhibits

#### Respondent's Exhibits

- (1) Exhibit 1 - Two-page letter to Franklin Z. Wickham, Ohio State Board of Pharmacy, from Judith K. Smith dated February 4, 1991.
- (2) Exhibit 2 - Certification of Licensure of Judith K. Smith from the State of Michigan, Department of Licensing and Regulation received January 30, 1991.

#### Findings Of Fact

- (1) On January 10, 1991, Judith K. Smith was notified by letter of her right to a hearing, her rights in such hearing, and her right to submit her contentions in writing.
- (2) As demonstrated by return receipt of January 12, 1991, Judith K. Smith received the letter of January 10, 1991 informing her of the allegations against her, and her rights.

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Order of the Board

- (3) Judith K. Smith submitted a letter, received February 11, 1991, setting forth her position and contentions in writing, and has requested her letter of February 4, 1991 speak on her behalf in this matter.
- (4) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Judith K. Smith, on or about September 1, 1990, submitted a Continuing Pharmacy Education Report Form providing documentation of her continuing pharmacy education in another state pursuant to paragraph (F) of Ohio Administrative Code Rule 4729-7-02 with the application for renewal of a pharmacist identification card.
- (5) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Judith K. Smith, on or about November 5, 1990, was notified that her continuing pharmacy education was being audited pursuant to paragraph (C) of Rule 4729-7-03 of the Ohio Administrative Code, and that she must provide evidence of the continuing pharmacy education documented on the Continuing Pharmacy Education Report Form submitted with her renewal application.
- (6) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that Judith K. Smith, failed to respond to the audit request in a timely manner and was provided with an opportunity for a hearing.
- (7) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State board of Pharmacy finds that on or about January 30, 1991 the required evidence of Judith K. Smith continuing her pharmacy education in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code Rules 4729-7-01 through 4729-7-07 as required by Ohio Revised Code Section 4729.12 was received by the Board.

#### Conclusion Of Law

- (1) The State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (6) and (7) of the Findings Of Fact do not constitute being guilty of dishonesty or unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy as provided in Division (A)(2) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### Action of the Board

The State Board of Pharmacy takes no action pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code concerning the pharmacist license, No. 03-2-07733, held by Judith K. Smith.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

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It is hereby certified by this Board that the above language is a copy of the Order entered upon its journal in this case.

Section 119.12 of the Revised Code authorizes an appeal from this Order. Such an appeal may be taken to the court of common pleas in the county in which your place of business is located or to said court of the county in which you reside. If you do not have a place of business in Ohio and are not a resident of Ohio, you may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio.

Such an appeal, setting forth the order appealed from and the grounds of the appeal, must be commenced by the filing of a Notice of Appeal with the State Board of Pharmacy and the appropriate court within fifteen (15) days after the mailing of this notice and in accordance with the requirements of Section 119.12 of the Revised Code.


