THE MATTER OF KIT ELLEN SNYDER CAME ON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY ON DECEMBER 2, 1987. MOTIONS WERE MADE AND RECORDED TO ADOPT THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

ORDER

Findings Of Fact

- (1) On October 16, 1987, Kit Ellen Snyder, R.Ph. No. 03-2-11456, was notified by letter of her right to a hearing, her rights in such hearing, and her right to submit her position, contentions, and arguments in writing.
- (2) As demonstrated by return receipt of October 22, 1987, Kit Ellen Snyder received the letter of October 16, 1987 informing her that the Board proposed to deny her application for renewal of her identification card since she had not continued her pharmacy education in accordance with Section 4729.12 of the Revised Code, and Chapter 4729-7 of the Administrative Code.
- (3) Kit Ellen Snyder has not responded in any manner to the letter of October 16, 1987, and has not requested a hearing in this matter.
- (4) The State Board of Pharmacy finds that Kit Ellen Snyder has not continued her pharmacy education in accordance with Chapter 4729-7 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
- (5) The State Board of Pharmacy finds that Kit Ellen Snyder has not submitted the required 4.5 CEUs needed for renewal of her pharmacist license.

Conclusion Of Law

- (1) The State Board of Pharmacy concludes that the conduct set forth in paragraphs (4) and (5) of the Findings Of Fact constitutes failure to meet the requirements for a renewal identification card as set forth in Section 4729.12 of the Ohio Revised Code.

OHIO STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

Pursuant to Section 4729.12 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the foregoing Findings Of Fact and Conclusion Of Law, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby denies the renewal application for an identification card of Kit Ellen Snyder.

After fifteen (15) days following the issuance of this Order, Kit Ellen Snyder may not engage in the active practice of pharmacy in Ohio, and may not compound or dispense dangerous drugs in Ohio.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.
