
STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY

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VS

NAZAR KASPARIAN, R.Ph.

THE MATTER OF NAZAR KASPARIAN, DOCKET NO. 6-146-2, CAME ON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY ON FRIDAY, JUNE 27, 1986. MOTIONS WERE MADE AND RECORDED THAT THE FOLLOWING ORDER BE ADOPTED:

ORDERFindings Of Fact

- (1) On February 3, 1986, Nazar Kasparian was notified by letter of his right to a hearing, his rights in such hearing, and his right to submit his contentions in writing.
- (2) As demonstrated by return receipt of February 5, 1986, Nazar Kasparian received the letter of February 3, 1986 informing him of the allegations, and his rights.
- (3) Nazar Kasparian has not responded in any manner to the letter of February 3, 1986 informing him of the allegations.
- (4) Upon consideration of the allegations against Nazar Kasparian and his failure to request a hearing, submit his position, contentions, or arguments in writing, or to otherwise deny the allegations, the State Board of Pharmacy finds that:
 - (a) Nazar Kasparian did willfully, knowingly, and intentionally violate Title 21, C.F.R. 1306.05(a), Section 893.04(1)(c), (2), (5), and (6), Florida Statutes (1981), and Section 465.016(1)(e), Florida Statutes (1981).
 - (b) Nazar Kasparian did willfully, knowingly, and intentionally violate Section 465.015(2)(c), Florida Statutes (1981).
 - (c) Nazar Kasparian did willfully, knowingly, and intentionally violate Section 465.015(2)(c), Florida Statutes (1981).
 - (d) Nazar Kasparian did willfully, knowingly, and intentionally violate Section 465.016(1)(i), Florida Statutes (1981).
 - (e) Nazar Kasparian, and/or other pharmacy employees under his supervision and control, at Kasparian Pharmacy, Inc., 196 Yonge Street, South Ormond Beach, Florida 32074, did sell controlled substances pursuant to false or forged prescriptions.

- (f) Nazar Kasparian, and/or other pharmacy employees under his supervision and control, at Kasparian Pharmacy, Inc., 196 Yonge Street, South Ormond Beach, Florida 32074, did intentionally make and knowingly possess approximately 224 false or forged prescriptions.

Conclusions Of Law

- (1) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that the conduct set forth in paragraphs (4)(a) through (4)(f) of the Findings Of Fact constitutes gross immorality.
- (2) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that the conduct set forth in paragraphs (4)(a) through (4)(f) of the Findings Of Fact constitutes dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy.
- (3) Upon consideration of the record as a whole, the State Board of Pharmacy concludes that the conduct set forth in paragraphs (4)(e) and (4)(f) of the Findings Of Fact, had it occurred in Ohio, would constitute willfully violating the provisions of Chapters 2925., 3715., 3719., and 4729. of the Ohio Revised Code.

Pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the foregoing Findings Of Fact and Conclusions Of Law, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends the pharmacist identification card held by Nazar Kasparian, No. 03-3-03962, for 24 months.

Division (B) of Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code provides in pertinent part that: "Any individual whose identification card is ..., suspended, ..., shall return his identification card and certificate of registration to the offices of the state board of pharmacy within ten days after receipt of notice of such action." The certificate and identification card should be forwarded by certified mail, return receipt requested.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.
