THE MATTER OF DAVID G. SHIPPER CAME ON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY ON APRIL 30, 1987. MOTIONS WERE MADE AND RECORDED THAT THE FOLLOWING ORDER BE ADOPTED:

ORDER

Findings Of Fact

- (1) On December 12, 1986, David G. Shipper, R.Ph. No. 03-2-11250, was notified by letter of his right to a hearing, his rights in such hearing, and his right to submit his contentions in writing.
- (2) As demonstrated by return receipt, David G. Shipper received the letter of December 12, 1986 informing him of the Board's proposal to deny the renewal of his pharmacist identification card, and his rights.
- (3) David G. Shipper has not responded in any manner to the letter of December 12, 1986 and has not requested a hearing in the matter.
- (4) The State Board of Pharmacy finds that David G. Shipper permitted his Ohio pharmacist identification card to lapse on September 15, 1981.
- (5) The State Board of Pharmacy finds that David G. Shipper has not continually practiced pharmacy in another state under a certificate issued by the authority of such state as required for renewal of a license which has been lapsed for three or more years.

Conclusion Of Law

- (1) The State Board of Pharmacy concludes that David G. Shipper does not meet the requirements for renewal of his pharmacist identification card as set forth in Section 4729.13 of the Revised Code.

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Order of the Board

Pursuant to Section 4729.13 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the foregoing Findings Of Fact and Conclusion Of Law, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby denies the renewal application of David G. Shipper.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

MOTION CARRIED.

It is hereby certified by this Board that the above language is a copy of the Order entered upon its journal in this case.

Section 119.12 of the Revised Code authorizes an appeal from this Order. Such an appeal may be taken to the court of common pleas in the county in which your place of business is located or to said court of the county in which you reside. If you do not have a place of business in Ohio and are not a resident of Ohio, you may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio.

Such an appeal, setting forth the order appealed from and the grounds of the appeal, must be commenced by the filing of a Notice of Appeal with the State Board of Pharmacy and the appropriate court within fifteen (15) days after the mailing of this notice and in accordance with the requirements of Section 119.12 of the Revised Code.
