C O N S E N T A G R E E M E N T

This Consent Agreement is entered into by and between Charles Wilbur Overly, R.Ph. and the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy, a state agency charged with enforcing the Pharmacy Practice Act and Dangerous Drug Distribution Act, Chapter 4729. of the Ohio Revised Code.

Charles Wilbur Overly enters into this Agreement being fully informed of his rights afforded under Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, including the right to representation by counsel and the right to a formal adjudication hearing on the issues contained herein.

This Agreement is entered into on the basis of the following stipulations, admissions, and understandings:

1. The Ohio State Board of Pharmacy is empowered by Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code to suspend, revoke, place on probation, refuse to grant or renew an identification card, or impose a monetary penalty on the license holder for violation of any of the enumerated grounds.
2. Charles Wilbur Overly is licensed to practice pharmacy in the State of Ohio.
3. Charles Wilbur Overly is knowingly and voluntarily acknowledging that he allowed his license to lapse from September 16, 1990 to November 15, 1990, and from September 16, 1989 to December 11, 1989, and practiced pharmacy while the license was lapsed.

Wherefore, in consideration of the foregoing and mutual promises hereinafter set forth, and in lieu of any formal proceedings at this time, Charles Wilbur Overly knowingly and voluntarily agrees with the State Board of Pharmacy to the following:

1. Charles Wilbur Overly agrees to the imposition of a monetary penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500.00).
2. Charles Wilbur Overly understands that the State Board of Pharmacy will suspend \$400.00 of the monetary penalty on condition that Charles Wilbur Overly does not further violate any laws under Chapter 4729. of the Ohio Revised Code.
3. The one hundred dollar monetary penalty that was not suspended is due and owing within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this Agreement. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed to the State Board of Pharmacy, 77 S. High Street, 17th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320, with the enclosed form.
4. If Charles Wilbur Overly violates any laws under Chapter 4729., he agrees to the imposition of the portion of the monetary penalty the Board originally suspended.

If, in the judgment of the Board, Charles Wilbur Overly appears to have violated or breached any terms or conditions of this Agreement, the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy reserves the right to institute formal disciplinary proceedings for any and all possible violations or breaches, including but not limited to, alleged violation of the laws of Ohio occurring before the effective date of this Agreement.

Charles Wilbur Overly acknowledges that he has had an opportunity to ask questions concerning the terms of this Agreement and that all questions asked have been answered in a satisfactory manner.

Any action initiated by the Board based on alleged violation of this Agreement shall comply with the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code.

Charles Wilbur Overly waives any and all claims or causes of action he may have against the State of Ohio or the Board, and members, officers, employees, and/or agents of either, arising out of matters which are the subject of this Agreement.

In the event the Board, at its discretion, does not approve this Agreement, this settlement offer is withdrawn and shall be of no evidentiary value and shall not be relied upon or introduced in any disciplinary action or appeal by either party. Charles Wilbur Overly agrees that should the Board reject this Agreement and if this case proceeds to hearing, he will assert no claim that the Board was

prejudiced by its review and discussion of this Agreement or of any information relating thereto.

This Consent Agreement shall be considered a public record, as that term is used in Section 149.43 of the Ohio Revised Code, and shall become effective upon the last date of signature below.
