THE MATTER OF ALICIA MARIE AUMENTADO CAME ON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY ON THURSDAY, APRIL 6, 1989 AS A RESULT OF THE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD BY HEARING OFFICER AND BOARD MEMBER BETTY NICHOL. FOLLOWING CONSIDERATION OF THE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION, THE TRANSCRIPT OF THE HEARING, AND EVIDENCE ADDUCED AT THE HEARING, MOTIONS WERE MADE AND RECORDED THE FOLLOWING ORDER BE ADOPTED:

## ORDER

### Findings Of Fact

The State Board of Pharmacy hereby agrees with and adopts the Findings Of Fact set forth in the Report and Recommendation of Hearing Officer and Board Member Betty Nichol, as follows:

- (1) The State Board of Pharmacy finds that Alicia Marie Aumentado, on or about July 1, 1988, submitted a continuing pharmacy education report form providing evidence of 4.5 CEUs of continuing pharmacy education with her application for renewal of her pharmacist identification card.
- (2) The State Board of Pharmacy finds that Alicia Marie Aumentado has not submitted the required proof of continuing pharmacy education as reported on her continuing pharmacy education report form for renewal of her pharmacist identification card.

Conclusion Of Law

The State Board of Pharmacy hereby agrees with and adopts the Conclusion Of Law set forth in the Report and Recommendation of Hearing Officer and Board Member Betty Nichol, as follows:

- (1) The State Board of Pharmacy concludes that paragraphs (1) and (2) of the Findings Of Fact constitutes dishonesty and unprofessional conduct in the practice of pharmacy.

Action Of The Board

The State Board of Pharmacy hereby agrees with and adopts the recommendation for action set forth in the Report and Recommendation of Hearing Officer and Board Member Betty Nichol. Therefore, pursuant to Section 4729.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the State Board of Pharmacy takes the following actions concerning the pharmacist license held by Alicia M. Aumentado:

(A) On the basis of the Conclusion Of Law set forth above, the State Board of Pharmacy hereby suspends the pharmacist identification card held by Alicia Marie Aumentado for 6 months and imposes a monetary penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), due and owing within thirty (30) days of the issuance of this Order. The monetary penalty should be made payable to the "Treasurer, State of Ohio" and mailed to the State Board of Pharmacy, 77 S. High Street, 17th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0320, with the enclosed form.

(B) Further, the Board will suspend the suspension on condition that Alicia Marie Aumentado provides proof within sixty days of 0.85 CEU, with the understanding that the experience(s) submitted will not be valid for any future continuing pharmacy education requirements for renewal of her Ohio pharmacist identification card. Ms. Aumentado may use 0.15 CEU from line five of the continuing pharmacy education report form if she can provide proof of the same.

THIS ORDER WAS APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.

It is hereby certified by this Board that the above language is a copy of the Order entered upon its journal in this case.

Section 119.12 of the Revised Code authorizes an appeal from this Order. Such an appeal may be taken to the court of common pleas in the county in which your place of business is located or to said court of the county in which you reside. If you do not have a place of business in Ohio and are not a resident of Ohio, you may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas in Franklin County, Ohio.
