



COVID-19 Response Efforts - March 20, 2020

The State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy is committed to protecting the health and safety of Ohioans during the COVID-19 outbreak. The Board posted a document on its website that provides COVID-19 guidance and response efforts, including the issuance of waivers to assist licensees in addressing operational needs. New and Updated COVID-19 Waivers Issued

- Authorized the temporary expansion of the maximum days' supply permitted under rule 4729-9-23 of the Administrative Code from 31 days to 60 days. This guidance can be accessed <u>here</u>. (NOTE: Originally issued on 3/18/2020)
- Authorized licensees to perform sterile compounding for another licensee, referred to as central compounding. This guidance can be accessed <u>here</u>.
- Authorized registered pharmacy technicians to stock automated drug storage systems and send and receive copies of non-controlled prescriptions, under certain conditions. Additionally, provides clarification on the positive identification requirements for technicians transferring prescriptions. This guidance can be accessed <u>here</u>.

Practicing Pharmacy in a Safe and Effective Manner - Mandatory Requirements UPDATED 3/19/2020!

On March 18, 2020, the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy issued **<u>mandatory requirements</u>** for pharmacies to implement safeguards to ensure pharmacy professionals practice in a safe and effective manner.

On March 19, 2020, the Board issued an update to these requirements clarifying provisions on immunization administration as follows:

- Pharmacists and pharmacy interns shall no longer be permitted to administer immunizations or other injections without standard protective measures, which includes gloves and proper hand hygiene (i.e. routinely washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds). Standard protective measures **do not** include the use of masks or gowns.
- Pharmacists and pharmacy interns shall not administer any immunizations or other injections to patients displaying or reporting symptoms of respiratory illness, including any of the following:
 - Fever (NOTE: This does not require mandatory temperature checks);
 - Cough; or
 - Shortness of breath.
