Notable Investigative Events

• A Warren County jury convicted Ohio pharmacist Timothy Hopkins of possession of drugs (steroids). He is awaiting sentence.

• Franklin County physician Mark Fettman was indicted by a Franklin County Grand Jury on 147 felony counts including money laundering, engaging in a pattern of corrupt activity, and drug trafficking. This matter was investigated by our OARRS Investigative Unit.

* Sentencings in early May

- Franklin County pharmacist and physician Eskender Getachew was convicted of unlawful distribution and dispensing of controlled substances in U.S. District Court Southern District of Ohio. He was sentenced to six months incarceration followed by three years of supervised release.
- A jury in US District Court Sothern District of Ohio convicted Belmont County pain management physician Thomas Romano of 24 counts of unlawful distribution of controlled substances. Romano was sentenced to 84 months incarceration. Board agents investigated this matter as part of the Appalachian Region Opioid Strike Force (ARPO).
