HB73 AUTHORIZE PRESCRIBING OFF-LABEL DRUGS (GROSS J, LOYCHIK M) To authorize the prescribing of off-label drugs and if prescribed, to require their dispensing and to name this act the Dave and Angie Patient and Health Provider Protection Act.

HB80 PHARMACIST CARE (LIPPS S) Regarding pharmacist care.
