Ohio's Acute Pain Prescribing Rules Effective Today

Effective August 31, 2017, the State of Ohio will have new rules for prescribing opioid analgesics for the treatment of acute pain. Please be advised that the responsibility of adhering to the limits is the responsibility of the prescriber. Pharmacists should be aware that there are exceptions to the rules and therefore there is no expectation that pharmacists enforce the limits.

The assist in the implementation of these new rules, the State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy developed updated guidance documents for <u>prescribers</u> and <u>pharmacists</u>. Additionally, the State Medical Board of Ohio has also developed educational materials for prescribers, <u>including a video overview of the rules</u>.

Out-of-State Pharmacists Needed to Aid Texas Disaster Recovery Effort

USP General Chapter <800> Hazardous Drugs - Handling in Healthcare Settings

The Board has received several inquiries regarding the update of pharmacy compounding rules to require compliance with <u>USP 800</u>. The Board will be considering such changes this fall. Fee Increases - Effective September 29, 2017

Effective September 29, 2017, provisions of Ohio HB 49 (Biennial Budget) go into effect. One such provision included in the budget is a new set of application fees charged by the Board for the following licenses:

- Category II Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs \$160.00 (includes limited licenses)
- Category III Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs \$220.00 (includes limited licenses)
- Category II & III Terminal Distributor of Dangerous Drugs Veterinary Facility \$60.00
- Category II Wholesale Distributor of Dangerous Drugs \$950
- Category III Wholesale Distributor of Dangerous Drugs (controlled substances) \$1,000

Please be advised, persons applying for licensure on or after September 29, 2017 will be expected to include the new fees.

Transfer or Sale of Naloxone by EMS Agencies
