## Reminder: Notice on the Enforcement of USP Compounding Chapters for Pharmacies

This notice only applies to pharmacies. A separate update for prescriber compounders will be released soon.

The State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy is aware of <u>USP's recent announcement</u> that was released on September 23, 2019, pertaining to the effective dates of revised USP Chapters <795>, <797>, and <825>. The Board has received multiple inquiries as to how this announcement will affect the Board's enforcement of USP <800> when it becomes effective December 1, 2019.

Please be advised that the Board will **NOT** begin enforcing <USP 800> on December 1, 2019.

Rather, the Board will be discussing the effective date of updated compounding rules that require adherence to USP <800> for all drugs listed in table one on the <u>National Institute for</u> <u>Occupational Safety and Health's List of Antineoplastic and Other Hazardous Drugs in Healthcare</u> <u>Settings</u> at its November meeting. ## National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

**Saturday, October 26th** is National Prescription Drug Take Back Day, which aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications.

The State of Ohio Board of Pharmacy encourages you to inform your patients of this great opportunity to safely dispose of unused prescription drugs. Recent data from the National Survey on Drug Use and Health found that 51 percent of those who misused prescription pain relievers in the past year obtained the prescription pain relievers they had most recently misused from a friend or relative for free. To reduce opportunities for diversion, it is important to regularly dispose of leftover medication.
