## **New COVID-19 Waivers Issued**

- Authorized prescribers working in an opioid treatment program licensed as a terminal distributor of dangerous drugs to temporarily delegate personally furnishing of buprenorphine products to nurses licensed under Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code. This guidance can be accessed here.
- Authorized home delivery of medications by opioid treatment programs under specific conditions. This guidance can be accessed here.
- Authorized an extension of basic life-support training certifications for pharmacists and pharmacy interns. This guidance can be accessed <a href="here">here</a>.
- Authorized prescribers to delegate personally furnishing non-controlled drug samples to nurses licensed in accordance with Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code. This guidance can be accessed here.
- Authorized the temporary expansion of the maximum days' supply permitted under rule 4729-9-23 of the Administrative Code from 31 days to 60 days. This extension only applies to prescriptions dispensed to patients residing in long-term care facilities. This guidance can be accessed here.
