Expedited Onboarding of Pharmacy Technician Trainees – Expires January 1, 2024

Effective January 1, 2024, the resolution authorizing the expedited onboarding of pharmacy technician trainees will expire. The resolution, authorized during the COVID-19 pandemic, allowed the Board's Licensing Department to grant trainee applicants conditional approval to begin working as a pharmacy technician trainee while they completed the application requirements (e.g., BCI and FBI criminal records check).

After January 1, 2024, the Board will no longer issue conditional approval status.

<u>Therefore, pharmacy technician trainees must have all application requirements submitted with their application to the Board to receive their Active registration.</u>

New Rules Permit Pharmacist Verification of Prescriber Compounded Medications

Effective November 16, 2023, rule <u>4729:7-3-07</u> authorizes a prescriber to delegate a pharmacist to perform medication validation ("final check") of a finished compounded drug preparation prior to it being administered to a patient.

DEA Releases Updated Guidance on MATE Act

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 enacted a new **one-time**, eight-hour training requirement for all DEA-registered practitioners, except veterinarians, on the treatment and management of patients with opioid or other substance use disorders.

Beginning on June 27, 2023, all DEA-registered and new medical practitioners are required to attest to completion of the training when renewing or completing an initial registration.

REMINDER: Pharmacists who obtain a mid-level DEA registration under a consult agreement are required to meet these training requirements.
